

Notice on the Commemoration of the 100th Anniversary of the Founding of the Inner Mongolian People's Party

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Inner Mongolian People's Party.

A century ago, a group of patriotic intellectuals from Southern Mongolia, following the norms of international political movements at the time, established a political party, the Inner Mongolian People's (Revolutionary) Party, with a clear goal and action plan. This marked a new era in the struggle for national independence and separation from China. In fact, it was a continuation of the Mongolian people's armed struggle to defend their homeland and save the nation, which had erupted repeatedly even before the collapse of the Qing Dynasty.

Since its inception, the Inner Mongolian People's Party played a pivotal role in the national liberation movement in Southern Mongolia. In the western region of Southern Mongolia, it organized and led large-scale armed resistance. After World War II, it made unremitting efforts in the eastern regions aimed at achieving independence and uniting with the Mongolian People's Republic.

During the colonial rule of Communist China, the Party's activities were forced underground. In the 1980s, when the political climate in China eased slightly, the Party's organizational activities were secretly resumed, initially within universities in Southern Mongolia. As a key actor, it actively engaged in student demonstrations and various nationalist movements of the period.

At the end of the 20th century, members of the Inner Mongolian People's Party abroad announced the public resumption of party activities, introducing Southern Mongolia to the international community and raising awareness in the free world about the Southern Mongolian issue, particularly the human rights situation, taking a significant step toward gaining international support and solidarity.

Although it is impossible to determine how many noble-minded and devoted individuals carried out activities under the name of the Inner Mongolian People's Party or how many branches existed during times of war and colonial rule, we must remember that it was these people who collectively carried forward this never-extinguishing torch, the Inner Mongolian People's Party, over the past 100 years.

The Inner Mongolian People's Party is the political legacy and pride of all Southern Mongolians, a glorious milestone in the struggle for national liberation. Commemorating this anniversary is, in itself, a strong protest against Communist China and a declaration to the world that the Southern Mongolian people's fight for freedom will never cease.

We warmly invite all members of the Inner Mongolian People's Party at home and abroad, human rights activists for Southern Mongolia, supporters, sympathizers, and concerned Mongolian compatriots to participate in the commemorative event.
